The **Georgia Statewide Afterschool Network (GSAN)** plays a pivotal role in advancing Georgia's afterschool and youth development field by engaging new and existing partners, supporting quality improvement and professional development, and working toward the sustainability of the field through policy and advocacy.

#### **NOTABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2017 INCLUDE:**

### **Quality Program Supports**



Launched the Georgia Afterschool E-Learning Institute, an online learning platform for afterschool and summer learning providers.



Piloted a technical assistance (TA) and coaching system for 19 afterschool programs aligned to the GA ASYD Quality Standards in partnership with GUIDE, Inc.



Selected and supported six summer programs in Atlanta in implementing the Zero Robotics Program.

# Sustainability



Hosted the first *Brews for Afterschool* fundraiser celebrating Lights on Afterschool.



Secured two new multi-year grants from the Goizueta and Mott Foundations totaling \$420,000 over the next three years.



Grew to three full-time staff with additional support provided by an Americorps VISTA member and MSW intern.

## **Policy and Advocacy**



Helped save 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC), the only federal funding for afterschool from elimination in the federal budget.



Hosted two summer opportunity workgroups as a part of a long-term advocacy strategy around summer.



Successfully advocated for five of GSAN's comments to be included in Georgia's Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) state plan.

## **Policy and Advocacy**



Developed and launched an Afterschool Community Champion Program to build a network of advocates across the state.



Registered over 350 programs for GSAN's map, Georgia's only searchable map dedicated to out-of-school time programs.



Hosted three community conversations in Atlanta, Albany, and Savannah to educate and build connections around afterschool.

# Serving as Georgia's statewide afterschool network since 2004, GSAN has:

- ➤ Collaborated with the Georgia Division of Family and Children Services and Departments of Education and Public Health to develop and release the Georgia Afterschool & Youth Development (ASYD) Quality Standards, Georgia's first out-of-school time standards.
- Supported the Georgia Afterschool & Youth Development Conference in 2013, 2014, and 2016, reaching more than 600 participants each year.
- ▶ Provided quality professional development opportunities including two multi-day Georgia Afterschool Institutes and several one-day training sessions.
- ► Hosted Mayoral Summits on Afterschool in Atlanta, Milledgeville, and Hinesville in partnership with the Georgia Municipal Association.
- ➤ Supported the development of training and curriculum around high demand topics such as physical activity, sustainability, global learning, and STEM by bringing in new partners and funders.

By supporting afterschool and summer learning programs in Georgia, we're preparing our future leaders for tomorrow and helping our families, businesses, and communities thrive.

The Georgia Statewide Afterschool Network (GSAN) is a public-private collaborative that envisions a day when all communities in Georgia provide exceptional afterschool programming. Our mission is to advance, connect, and support quality afterschool programs to promote the success of children and youth throughout Georgia.

GSAN is one of 50 statewide afterschool networks supported by the C.S. Mott Foundation. Since 2013, Voices for Georgia's Children (Voices), a nonprofit child policy and advocacy organization, has served as thefiscal sponsor of GSAN.
