Federal Updates

The American Rescue Plan provides funds that can be used to support young people during out-of-school time.

- ESSER Funds \$4.25 billion 90% goes directly to school districts;
 10% stays at GaDOE
- State level (SEAs) funds available:
 - \$42 million set-aside for summer enrichment
 - \$42 million set-aside for afterschool programs
 - o 5%, approximately \$212 million, for learning recovery (afterschool/summer/ELT)
- District level funds 20% set aside provided to LEAs for learning recovery strategies, including afterschool and summer enrichment

Federal Updates

The American Rescue Plan provides funds that can be used to support young people during out-of-school time.

- \$1.5 billion for child care, which can include school-age care, which will flow to state child care agencies
 - Expanded Child Care Assistance \$605 million (estimated)
 - Child Care Stabilization Funds \$968 million (estimated)
 - Can be used for school age child care

Federal Updates

The American Rescue Plan provides funds that can be used to support young people during out-of-school time nationally.

- \$1 billion for Corporation for National and Community Service through AmeriCorps for AmeriCorps positions to help address learning recovery and other purposes
- \$350 billion for state and local governments that can be used in part for child care and other purposes

GSAN 2021 Summer Learning Plans Survey

Direct Payments & Credits

- Direct payments of \$1,400 for individuals making up to \$75,000, and couples making up to \$150,000.
- Temporarily expands the Child Tax Credit, increasing the amount to \$3,000 for children ages 6 to 17, and \$3,600 for children under age 6. Calculate yours here.
- Increases the Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit, for those who paid expenses for care of a child/dependent so that they can work or look for work, from a maximum of \$1,050 for one child to \$4,000; and from \$2,100 for two or more children to \$8,000.

Unemployment

- Maintains the federal supplement of \$300 per week to unemployment insurance benefits and extends it through September 6, 2021.
- Makes the first \$10,200 in unemployment insurance received in 2020 non-taxable for households with incomes under \$150,000.

Small Business

- \$7.25 billion for the Paycheck Protection Program forgivable loans and expands eligibility to more non-profits (larger non-profits and includes those that engage in advocacy and limited lobbying)
- \$15 billion for targeted Economic Injury Disaster Loan advance payments, which are available to businesses in low-income communities that have suffered an economic loss of more than 30%


