**INSTRUCTION PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

**Pre-K Students**

- Designed for Rising Kindergarteners
- Grant based program
- 29 Instructional days
- 7 week term, starting June 1st and ending July 19th
- 4 days a week, 8:00 am to 2:30 pm instructional day.
  - Exception: June 1st – 4th and July 6th – 9th (Tuesday – Friday)**
- Curriculum is scripted through the Georgia Early Learning and Development Standards (GELDS)
- Breakfast, lunch and transportation available for all students
- School PIE partners and community partners for opportunities for each campus to have planned additional enrichment activity

**K-8 Students**

- 6 week term, starting June 1st and all K-8 programs will end on July 9th
- 4 days a week, 8 a.m. to 12 noon instructional day (5 hour day for faculty)
- Exception: June 1st – 4th and July 6th – 9th (Tuesday – Friday)
- Breakfast, Lunch and Transportation available for all students
- Uses special curriculum meant for summer programs
- Will also include a specials/connections opportunity for each school (should be school choice based on greatest interest)
- Will leverage school PIE partners and community partners for opportunities for each campus to have some kind of additional enrichment activity
- In-person and virtual option will be available (highly recommend in-person option)**

**ELA/Reading: Scholastic Summer Lit Camp**

- Scripted curriculum based on a summer camp experience
- Approximate instructional time of two hours

**Mathematics: BellXcel**

- Scripted curriculum
- Approximate instructional time one hour
- Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) is embedded throughout the lessons
- Transitions and breaks will be determined by summer learning site administration
- Enrichment Activities
- Utilize community partners or school PIE partners – flexible based on school and student interest (student survey results)
- Approximate enrichment time one hour
- Professional Development: Scheduled for May 25th in two hour sessions throughout day

**9-12 High School Students**

- Each campus will determine its own program aimed at credit recovery and/or extended semester
- Will include SEL and ACT/SAT support
- 4 days a week, 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 pm instructional day (5 hour day for faculty)
- Exception: June 1st – 4th and July 6th – 9th (Tuesday – Friday)
- Breakfast, Lunch and Transportation available for all students
- Program run until completion or July 9th (supports a July 22nd summer graduation)
