Tyiska's Training & Quality Corner

July marks the end of Year 1 for the BOOST grants program, and I want to thank you for your attendance and training feedback. We are excited that our evaluation partner was able to take your feedback from the training surveys and compile a comprehensive analysis for us. We want to utilize the results to build a better Year 2 and more continued quality trainings. Over the next couple of weeks, I want to share with you a few the training results.

- **Administration Trainings:**

Participants overwhelmingly found information related to financial planning—including reporting, developing budgets, and accounting—to be the most useful. They also found information related to grant management, including compliance and issues specific to federal funding, helpful.

“As a new member of the nonprofit workforce, I appreciated the fact that the webinar delved into every aspect of budgeting in a way even people that are not 100% familiar with it could understand and learn from.” –BOOST Training Participant

- **Quality Trainings:**

Participants found information about how to use standards and the self-assessment process to be very useful in thinking about how to improve their own programs. They were pleased to receive resources including worksheets, online links, and the ASYD resource packet. Some were especially eager to be able to share those materials with colleagues.

“I appreciated that the training emphasized the importance of incorporating the entire staff

into the evaluation process so that every team member can understand why the target outcomes are important to the organization and useful to the community and so that every staff member feels ownership of the organizations' ultimate outcomes and responsibilities.” – BOOST Training Participant

- **Programming Trainings:**

Participants were pleased with the shareable resources they received, including handouts, slides, templates, database, and app. Several participants found the ability to talk with other BOOST grantees useful, with some especially appreciative of the breakout groups.

- **Leadership Trainings:**

Participants found specific topics presented during the trainings, such as the Developmental Relationship Framework and Tips for Effective Delegation helpful. Participants that attended the “Youth Voice” training were enthusiastic about the inclusion of teen presenters in their training.
