Learning Loss Grant Opportunity

[United Way of Greater Atlanta](#) and the [Georgia Division of Family and Children Services](#) have collaborated to reduce COVID-induced learning loss by implementing a statewide competitive grant. The Learning Loss Grant will provide awards of up to \$50,000 to support community-based organizations in Georgia who are reducing learning loss for low-income youth through building reading skills, improving math proficiency, supporting school transition, strengthening family engagement, supporting learning acceleration, increasing access to quality out of school time and contextualizing learning. **Applications open October 3 and close October 28. Update on Year 2 Afterschool Budgets

The GSAN and GaDOE teams continue to work daily on pre-approving your Year 2 afterschool budgets and preparing them with the formats and codes required to meet new Grants Accounting standards. Please work proactively on any Field Trip Approval Forms or Capital Expenditure Prior Approval forms as appropriate for your afterschool budget. Another time-saving step will be to check the Certificate of Insurance that you've uploaded to the Consolidated Application in the MyGaDOE portal and replace it if it is expired. Grantees can check the online [Budget Status List](#) at any time to see the latest update on your budget process. Only when you have all green lights should you move forward with updating your electronic budget in the portal.
